Long Drought Is Broken By Showers Sunday Night Penney Co.

Many Sections Get Penney Manager Rain and Temperature Drops Sharply Around Midnight; More Rains Follow During Day.

The drought of ten days' duration, which was marked by some of the hottest weather ever experienced here, was definitely ended, at least for the time being, by a high wind and rain just before and after midnight Sunday. The night's rain was not heavy, being less than an inch-but was gradual, so that full benefit was obtained from all of it, which soaked into parched ground.

At the Carolina Power & Light sub-station a mile west of the city. where H. L. Ailen, official Weather Bureau observer, has his instruments. the rainfall was measured as .14 of an meh, but much more than that tell in the city, and to the north and west of town, and to some extent to the east, there were generous show-

The rain and the drop in temperature followed another hot day Sunday, when the maximum temperature was 102 at 3 p. m. The minimum for the night was 54, which was 14 degrees below the minimum for the tour previous nights, each of which had a reading of 68. At noos today the mercury stood at 90.

Generous snowers in those sections which received them checked deterioration of tobacco, cotton corn and other crops as well as gardens, all of which were suffering greatly

More rain came today, with a slow drizzing downpour for more than two hours from around 11:30 a. m. until litter - o'clock this afternoon. Temperatures remained moderate. with no excessive heat such as has prevailed for about ten days.

While the weather forecast was for a resumption of fair and warmer weather, the drought was broken here for the time being. Crops have been saved temporarily by the rain and railing temperature.

LIGHTNING CAUSES BURNING OF STABLE

Lightning set fire to a stable on the O. S. Falkner farm at Greystone last night about 10 o'clock, burning the structure to the ground. A quantity of hay, feeds, harness and farming implements, and a nice yearling were burned. Mules usually kept in the stable were not there at the time of the fire.




