U. S. Ships May Carry Refugees

Washington, Aug. 8. — (AP)—With only a few scattered "noes" the house passed neutrality act amendments yesterday which would permit American ships to enter belligerent waters to bring back refugee children from war-torn nations.

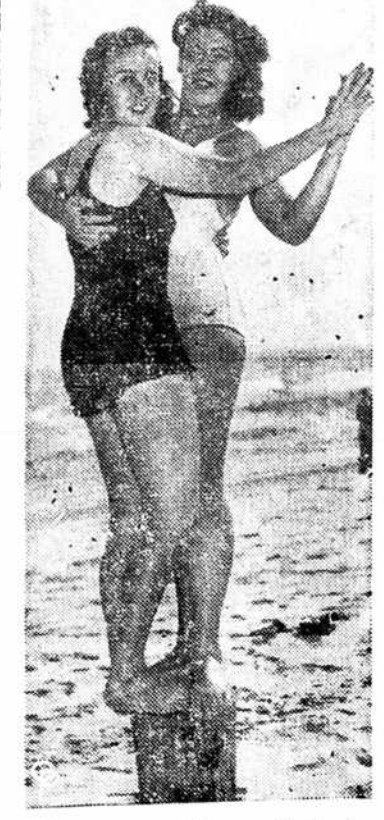
The legislation, which now goes to the senate, would authorize the transportation by unarmed and unconvoyed American ships, of youngsters under 16, provided the vessels are proceeding under safe conduct assurances from belligerent nations. The ships would be required to carry painted American flags on their sides and superstructure, along with statements that they are refugee-child rescue ships of the United States, "so that night or day there can be no mistake as to the identity of such vessels."

WILLKIE TO GET FREE RADIO TIME

San Francisco, Aug. 8. — (AP)—Wendell Willkie was assured today of free time over national radio networks in whatever amount President Roosevelt might use for campaigning during his "fireside chats" between now and the general election.

Mills Operate At High Rate

New York, Aug. 8. — Textile production during the first six months of 1940 was 6 per cent above that for the first half of 1939, according to Textile World's index of textile mill activity. The effect of the national defense program may push the rate for 1940 to a new high record, states Douglas G. Woolf, editor. He adds:

"Textile World's index of mill activity for the first half of 1940 stands at 132 (on a basis of 1923-25 as 100). This is the same rate as for the first year 1939—which incidentally was a record year in textile production. In other words, if the industry continues at the same rate for the rest of 1940, it will have equaled 1939, despite wide-spread predictions that this would be an 'off' year for textiles. "But there is more to the story than that. The current reverse ac-

tivity in national defense plans, involving not only direct Government purchases of textiles but the indirect boom effect on textiles from other industries even more vitally affected, would seem to promise such continued activity. There is the further possibility that the rate may be accelerated, and a new textile record set in 1940.

"The uncertainties of the situation—particularly those pertaining to European developments, need little emphasis; everyone is only too aware of them. There is also the question as to what extent American business, with its natural extremes of optimism and pessimism, may have over-anticipated the effects of the war and the defense program. Against these doubts, however, stands the hard, cold fact that this country has embarked upon a long period of intensive preparation. Industry must supply the needed equipment and materials. Bearish news from Europe might cause temporary recessions, but the general trend for at least the next year should be upward."

NEGRO DAY AUG. 16 AT "LOST COLONY"

Manteo, Aug. 8. — Third annual Negro Day will be held here Friday, August 16, in connection with the fourth summer season of Paul Green's drama of democracy "The Lost Colony," according to an announcement made today by L. P. Davis and D. Bradford Fearing, president of the Roanoke Island Historical Association, which sponsors the drama as a non-commercial venture.
