Troops Are Mobilized On Danube

German Plans to Build Naval Air Bases Near Constanta Are Reported; British Officials and Civilians

Bucharest, Oct. 14.--(AP)--Both Germany and Soviet Russia were reported speeday strengthening their military positions in the strategic area near the mouth of the Danube

Russia was said to be mobilizing picked troops along the lower Danube between its junction with the river Prut and the Black Sea on the southern border of Bessarabia and to be hurriedly building large gun emplacements along that line.

German plans to build a naval air base near Constanta, Rumania's main Black sea port, were authoritatively reported.

Precautions were made for the arrival of a German naval mission to join the nazi army airforce and general staff officers already in Rumania. It was said the naval officers would supervise construction of the reported Constanta base.
