#### Power and Light Company Cuts Its

New low rates for electricity for heating water, and new schedules giving reductions to certain industrial power customers and large commercial service customers will go into effect during the latter part of November in the terriotry served by the Carolina Power and Light Company L. V. Sutton, president of the company, announces.

The annual savings as result of the reductions to customers will amount to \$283,000, with North Carolina customers benefiting to the extent of \$218,500 annually and South Carolina customers \$64,500, it was said.

The amendment to the company's residential rate, as approved by the regulatory commissions in North and South Carolina," Mr. Sutton aid, "provides for a discount of onehalf cent per kilowatt-hour for automatic water heating which will mean a reduction in cost of this class if rervice of ataproximately 30 pc cut, or allow 40 to 50 per cent more r for the sense co t."
