What About Wars? During the last world war, I was an assistant to the secretary of Labor in Washington. I saw the selfish attempts both of capital and labor to make abnormal profits while their brothers were in the trenches in France...

Labor, however, will insist upon wage raises consistent with any raises in the cost of living. This means that to keep peace with labor and to insure maximum production, the cost of living must not get out

of hand. Labor leaders are watching the cost-of-living index as a cat watches a mouse. This is another reason for the administration to watch it likewise.

What is the Answer?

The answer to all the above is that we are headed inevitably for price fixing of some kind. This is being discussed in Washington as being discussed in Washington as the question is: shall we follow the program of World War I by fixing the prices of only a few commodities at first, and then gradually increase the number; or shall we fix the price of everything at one time?

This brings up again the question of politics even though the election is over! The agricultural districts want the prices of manufactured goods fixed; but not the prices of farm products. Strong pressure is being put on the administration to follow such a half-hearted policy. My own guess is that a "roof" will be put on everything including farm products; but this roof will not fix the price of everything at current quotations. The farmer will be allowed more room in the "attic" of his house.
