

When they were all eating, reclining in the Hebrew manner of the time on couches, leaning on one elbow with their heads toward the table, their feet extended outward, a woman of the streets came in with an alabaster box of ointment in her hand. She went up to Jesus and, weeping, she caressed His feet, washing them with her tears, drying them with her long hair, kissing them, and anointing them with the precious ointment.

The Pharisee was horrified. He did not associate with such people. Jesus, reading his mind, told him a parable. There was a man to whom two men owed money. He said. One owed him a good deal, the other a smaller sum. Neither could pay, so he forgave them both. Which, Jesus asked, would feel most gratitude, the one who owed a good deal or the one that owed little? The one that owed the most, said Simon. You are right, said Jesus, but when I entered your house you gave me no water for my feet; you did not give me the ceremonial kiss of welcome; you did not pour oil on my head as is the custom to honor a guest.
