

Citizens Bank Officers All Re-Elected For Year

Resources at End of 1940 Are \$3,605,530; Deposits Are \$3,180,107; To Retire One-Third of Preferred Stock

All officers and all but one of the directors of Citizens Bank & Trust Company were re-elected for 1941 at the annual meeting of stockholders and directors Wednesday afternoon at the bank.

Court Rules Johnsons To Leave State

Johnson Pleads Guilty to Subornation of Perjury and Zona Johnson Salsman Pleads Guilty to Perjury; Gales to Prison

Garland Johnson and Zona Johnson Salsman pleaded guilty to perjury charges in superior court today and each was ordered to leave the State for four years.

Garland Johnson was charged with subornation of perjury and was sent to State Prison for five years, judgment not to issue if he leaves the State by January 22 and stays off four years.

Zona Johnson Salsman pleaded guilty to perjury and was sentenced to two years in State's Prison, commitment not to issue if she leaves the State by noon January 15 and remains away four years.

Plane Crash Injures Two Men Seriously

The two occupants of a light airplane which crashed late yesterday in the Alced community, twelve miles northeast of Lenoir, are receiving treatment in Maria Parham hospital here and their condition was described today as still serious.

The men were identified as Harold J. Walsh, 37, of 6 Beacon street, Boston, Mass., pilot of the plane, and Al. W. Equihart, 36, of 16 Rathbone Circle, Quincy, Mass., his companion.

The plane fell to the ground after striking a tree about 100 feet from the rear of the Frank Murray home, near the Henry Edwards store.

The crash victims were brought to the local hospital in an ambulance. The motor of the plane was forced back between the wings, and the instrument panel and cockpit were not damaged.
