"BRASS TACKS" ON THE SUNDAY SCHOOL LESSON

(The International Uniform Lesson on the above topic for March 30, is Luke 24:36-53, the Golden Text being Luke 24:49, "Behold, I send forth the promise of My Father upon you.")

In last week's lesson, you remember, our Lord was put to death by His enemies and His body was consigned to the tomb of His friend, Joseph of Arimathea. The women who loved Him beheld the sepulchre and how the body was laid, and, after procuring spices and ointments to anoint the body, they left Him and went to observe the Sabbath.

Today we omit the scene at the tomb when the Marys went to anoint the body and found it gone, and take up our story when the disciples were gathered together talking, after some of them had seen the Risen Lord.

And as they thus spoke, Jesus Himself stood in the midst of them, and saith unto them, Peace be unto you, the typical eastern greeting. In spite of what they had heard of Jesus' resurrection from the dead, the disciples were terrified and frightened, and supposed that they had seen a spirit.

"And He said unto them, Why are ye troubled? and why do thoughts arise in your hearts?"

"Behold My hands and My feet, that it is I myself; handle Me, and see; for a spirit hath not flesh and bones, as ye see Me have."

At those words, they began to rejoice, but still could not believe, so Jesus asked them if they had any food, and when they brought some He ate it to show them that it was indeed He risen from the dead.

He reminded them how He had told them before His death that He would rise again to fulfill the law as written in Moses and the prophets concerning Him. "Then opened He their understanding, that they might understand the scriptures."

And further He said: "Thus it is written, and thus it behooved Christ to suffer, and to rise from the dead the third day:

"And that repentance and remission of sins should be preached in His name among all the nations, beginning at Jerusalem."

"And ye are witnesses of these things."

The disciples were to start their preaching at Jerusalem, but were told to tarry awhile, "until ye be endued with power on high"—the Holy Ghost.

Then He led them on the road to Jerusalem as far as Bethany, "and He lifted up His hands and blessed them."

"And it came to pass, while He blessed them, He was parted from them, and carried up into heaven."

All their fear had left them now. The 11 disciples left after the tragedy of Judas' treason and self-destruction, were filled with great joy. Heretofore, when they had met together they were in terror of arrest, and were most careful who was admitted to their presence. But their Master had returned, and although He had again been taken away, they had their instructions to spread the gospel throughout the nations and to fear not. So they worshiped Jesus and returned to Jerusalem, with great joy, where they were "continually in the temple," openly praising and blessing God.

thing or not—the railroads get their dollar or more per box as freight, the packing houses get their regular fee, while the middle men get their regular commissions. In fact, the more fruit there is, and the more off the grocer is, the more profit are made by these other people. After twenty winters in Florida, I have concluded that the problem will be rectified only through a pooling of the earnings of all these different

groups. When all suffer and prosper together then something will be done to help all. This also applies to the difficulty of co-operative exchanges who get their good salaries just the same, whatever happens to the poor growers. I include here, the growers of scores of other products from potatoes in Idaho to peaches in California, and peaches in Georgia.

Employment After the War. A second newspaper clipping reads as follows:

"For the first time in 10 years everyone willing to work in our town is fully employed. This compares with a large surplus of labor a few years ago. In fact, there is an actual shortage of labor here at the present time. Even our newspaper office is looking for two boys—a con-

clusion. I believe in a social structure which is founded on private ownership and which requires employers and wage workers, hiring and firing, and natural price levels, so long as these do not interfere with the greatest good for the greatest number. However, we can take care of the unemployed, when our own protection is at stake, we can protect them in times of peace. A truly Christian society demands some way of doing this, however it may be done. We must change our fatal individualistic philosophy which believes that only through the material enrichment of the individual is the community enriched. Some day we will put the good of the community—including ourselves—before any individual, including ourselves.

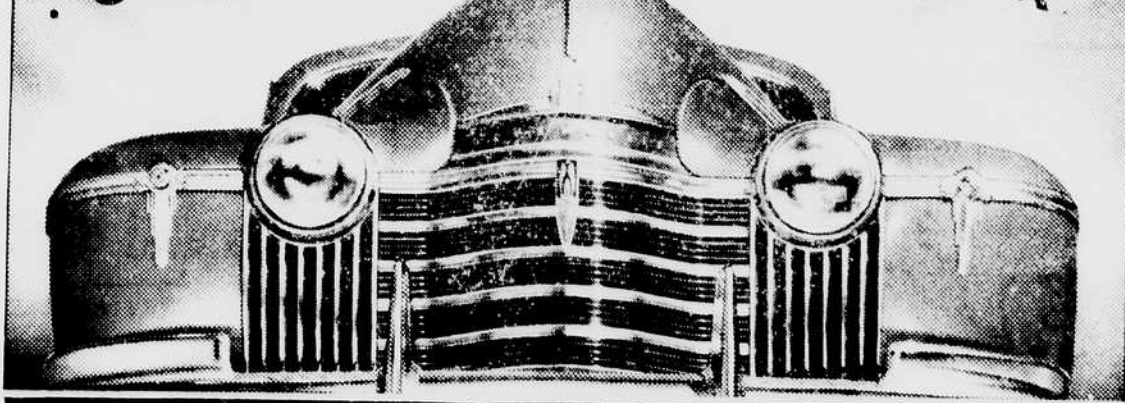
