Moving into Iran by land, sea and air, British, Russian and Indian forces quickly seized key points in the ancient land of the Persians. Bandar Shahpur (Persian Gulf terminus of the railroad to Teheran, the capital, the Russian border, and Afghanistan) fell to the British Navy. The huge oil refinery at nearby Abadan was taken by forces moving overland from Iraq. The Indian army moved in from the southeast, and the Russians advanced on Tabriz and Bandar Shah in the north. Racing to beat Germany to the vital oil supplies, Britain and Russia said they would give up the land after the war.
