The University professor says, however, that South Americans are being irritated by suspicious held toward them by North Americans.

This ought to be distinctly heartening to the United States, to whatever degree it is true.

An encouraging angle, too, has been that thus far every reported attempt of Nazis to gain a foothold in South America has been frustrated.

What lies behind that, though, is the feeling that South Americans are not firmly enough rooted in their own loyalties to resist as North Americans are.
