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## Deacs Hope To Defeat Texas Tech

Charlotte, Nov. 23.—(Special)—With the balloting for mythical all-stars just getting underway, members of the Wake Forest and Texas Tech teams will get one more chance to raise the standings Saturday when the two ball clubs clash here in the Memorial stadium.

Both teams should be a line to place several men on the all-star teams of these sections, but a good team in this section would have to be a lot of weight should there be any doubt hanging over the selections.

The Red Raiders have won eight games while losing but one and the Deacons total games won and lost are as impressive—five victories, four defeats, and one tie—but the Big Five record of Wake Forest is only to Duke. The Blue Devils, of course, are unbeaten, and they were the only North Carolina eleven to beat the Deacons this fall.

Wake Forest, Nov. 23.—One of the greatest freshman eleven in the history of Wake Forest will bring down the curtain on its 1941 season in Rocky Mount Friday night meeting the undefeated William and Mary team. The game is slated for the Rocky Mount Municipal stadium and will get underway at 7:30 o'clock.

Gastonia, Nov. 23.—(AP)—E. G. Boone, of Charlotte, N.Y.A. area director, arrived here yesterday with orders to re-open the N.Y.A. project at Orthopedic hospital after it was closed Tuesday along with six others in Gaston county.

The Gastonia Gazette said the project was closed because of N.Y.A. policy. John A. Lang, of Raleigh, state director, denied this caused the closing.

The Gazette quoted Boone as saying the project would be resumed today.

The newspaper also announced that United States Senator Josiah W. Bailey, Democrat, North Carolina, had advised it that he was taking up the matter with N.Y.A. officials in Washington.

College Station, Raleigh, Nov. 23.—Because of the war crisis, it is particularly important that every eligible cotton producer in North Carolina vote in the cotton marketing quota referendum scheduled for Saturday, December 13, declared G. T. Scott, chairman of the state AAA committee, at a meeting of the committee at State college this week.

"As a result of the war, most of our world market are cut off, and farmers must protect themselves from the bad effects of this situation by managing well their surplus supplies to fit actual needs. To do this they must make effective use of all features of the farm program, which includes marketing quotas and loans," he said.

Chairman Scott pointed out that American cotton exports have fallen from six million to about one million bales, and that such drastic reduction in exports normally would result in bankrupt prices. Marketing quotas and the loan, he pointed out, have helped hold cotton prices near parity. He also emphasized that without quotas, under the law there can be no loan.

## Rice Owls On Grid Slate Of Carolina

Chapel Hill, Nov. 27.—Rice University, which upset Tulane and led the team that knocked off Texas, has been added to the University of North Carolina football schedule for next year.

The Owls are the only new opponents on the Tar Heels' 1942 card, which was announced today by Athletic Director R. A. Fetzer.

The colorful Texas aerial circus, which is coached by Jess Neely, who also made a name for himself at Clemson, will come to Chapel Hill October 17. North Carolina and Richmond could not get together on dates for next year.

The Tar Heels will meet the Owls in Houston, Texas, in 1943.

The only other major change was the transfer of the annual classic with Virginia from Thanksgiving to Saturday, November 21. This gives the Tar Heels a full week instead of three days after the Duke battle.

The opening game was still pending. Coach Fetzer said The Tar Heels met Lenon-Rhyme from the North State Conference in the first game this year. And the location of the Davidson game has not yet been settled.

The Tar Heels will have an attractive schedule, opening with Wake Forest and South Carolina, both of which were strong this year, continuing with Rice, and reaching a home climax with the Duke headliner.

Carolina will also continue its inter-sectional features with Furman, which is a leading bowl candidate this year, and Tulane, which knocked off Boston and Vandy among others. The battle with the Wake will be in New Orleans again, and Carolina will also journey to Furman, N. C. State and Virginia.

In fact, the Tar Heels will face the same hard schedule they battled in 1941 except for Rice, and the Owls are expected to be much tougher than Richmond, judging from this year's records.

Rice is the team that nosed out the Tulane powerhouse, 19-9, in one of the year's biggest slammers. The Owls lost to the great Texas and Texas A. and M. elevens. However, Texas Christian upset Texas, which ranked as the nation's top five, and Rice came back to tie the Horned Frogs 0-0.

Head Coach Ray (Bear) Wolf came from Texas Christian, while Dick Jamerson, who is varsity swimming coach and assistant freshman football coach, attended and played for Rice.
