

## Broughton Urges Quotas

Raleigh, Dec. 5—Governor J. Melville Broughton, addressing North Carolina's farm populace last night, declared that "the present war situation is not proving a benefit to the cotton farmer," and indicated that with exports reduced 80 per cent, this year's cotton prices—highest since 1929—resulted in spite of the war and not because of it.

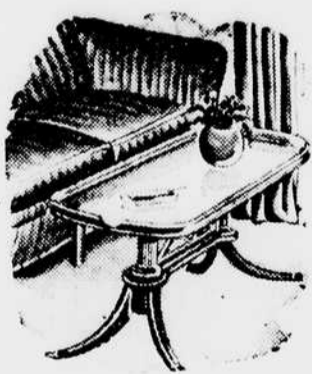
Appealing to the state's cotton growers—land owners, sharecroppers and tenants alike—to go to the polls December 13 and cast their ballots in the 1942 referendum on limiting quotas, Governor Broughton reminded his audience that "for the past eight years—since the early days of the AAA—cotton growers have worked wholeheartedly with the state and other crops in a cooperative effort to make a better living from the soil. The results of the four previous referenda on marketing quotas are evidence of this cooperation among cotton farmers."

Quotas, and the accompanying price supports, have been in effect for two past seasons, a period in which cotton prices have more than doubled from the 1937 figure of slightly more than eight cents. Prices have averaged better than 17 cents per pound in North Carolina this year.
