

Local Sugar Rationing Plans Await Appointment

Nomination of H. M. Robinson as County Administrator Not Yet Confirmed; Registration April 27-28 and May 4-5-6-7.

Preparations for the sugar rationing registration in Vance County have not yet been completed. It was learned today that final arrangements await confirmation by state rationing officials of the nomination of H. M. Robinson, Vance registrar of deeds, as county sugar rationing administrator.

John T. Christman, chairman of the Vance rationing board, said today that the nomination of Mr. Robinson for the post had been approved by the state officials but that confirmation of the nomination has not been made. Mr. Robinson would be custodian of the stamps and rationing books and would supervise the registration of industrial users in the total users on April 27 and 28 and of individuals on May 4-5-6-7.

War-time rationing of sugar will begin May 5 under orders of Price Administrator Lewis Harbo, and registration for rationing stamps will be carried out through the home of the public schools. The following regulations, in general, will govern the rationing program:

- One adult representative of each family unit may register and obtain ration books for the entire family.
- Family unit will not include members of other adults who are not blood relatives. They must register individually at their own family units.
- Soldiers on salaries leaving the United States for more than 30 days must surrender their ration books to local boards. Such books also must be turned over to a clerk within 14 days after the death of a person in whose name a book was issued.
- Children born after the registration date may be registered at any time subsequent to their parents' registration.
- The first stamp in the book will be valid for purchase of a pound of sugar in any one store and thereafter every 17-30 stamp No. 2 from May 31 to June 13 and stamp No. 4 from June 14-27.
- Supplies to restaurants will be reduced to half the amounts used in a base period which will be either the corresponding period of 1941 or the amount used during March, 1942. Records for last year are not available.
