Track, Baseball Events Head Card At North Carolina

Chapel Hill, April 30.—Track and baseball are the feature attractions in the University of North Carolina's attractive week-end sports program.

The varsity baseball team will play games Friday and Saturday. On Friday they will meet the strong Fort Bragg nine here at 4 o'clock on Emerson field.

Among the members of the Fort Bragg team are Privates Ham Strayhorn and Matty Hopkins, ex-Carolina stars. Strayhorn was the star catcher on Carolina's 1934 State and Southern Conference champions while Hopkins won his spurs at shortstop for the teams of 1937, 1938, and 1940.

The big day in sports comes on Saturday and fans will have an opportunity to see in their entirety both the baseball and track events.

Carolina and Navy will meet in a feature intercollegiate dual track meet beginning at 2 o'clock on Fetzer field. The meet will end shortly before 4 o'clock at which time Carolina and Virginia traditional rivals in all sports will clash in baseball on Emerson field.

Other University teams will be competing away from home. The undefeated varsity netmen will oppose Maryland at College Park in the first match on their annual winter tour.

The freshman track team will be at Anniston for an engagement with the strong Navy Pirates and the leading tennis team will meet Duke in a return scrap at Durham.

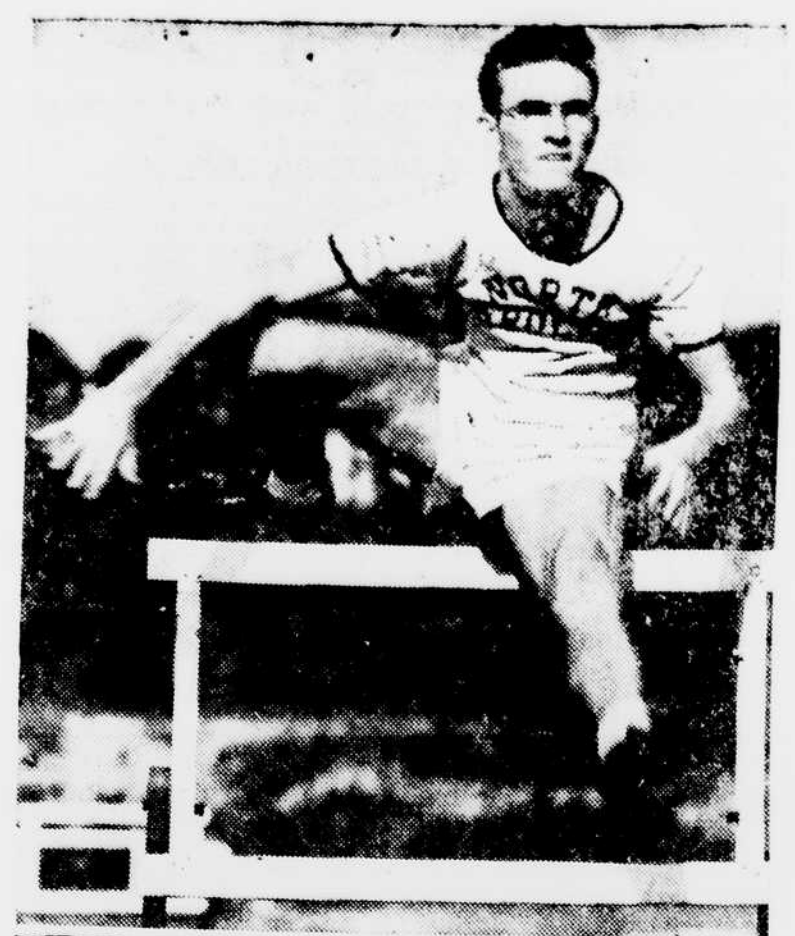
Incidents are the Carolina-Navy track meet a exciting match at a track. The Tar Heels will risk a perfect record against an institution which has beaten them handily in the past two years.

Mangum won the Conference indoor high hurdle crown in 1941 and Mengel won the event in the 1942 meet held last February.

He also led his team in runs batted in with 10 and was near the top in runs scored with nine.
