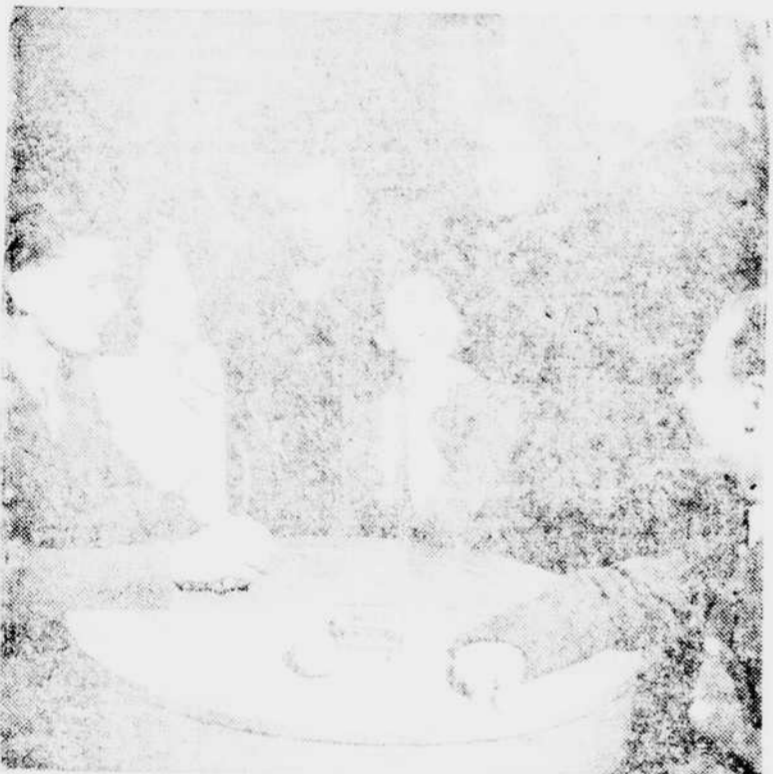


Service Card for Movie Star

Wins Nomination Arrives on Clipper



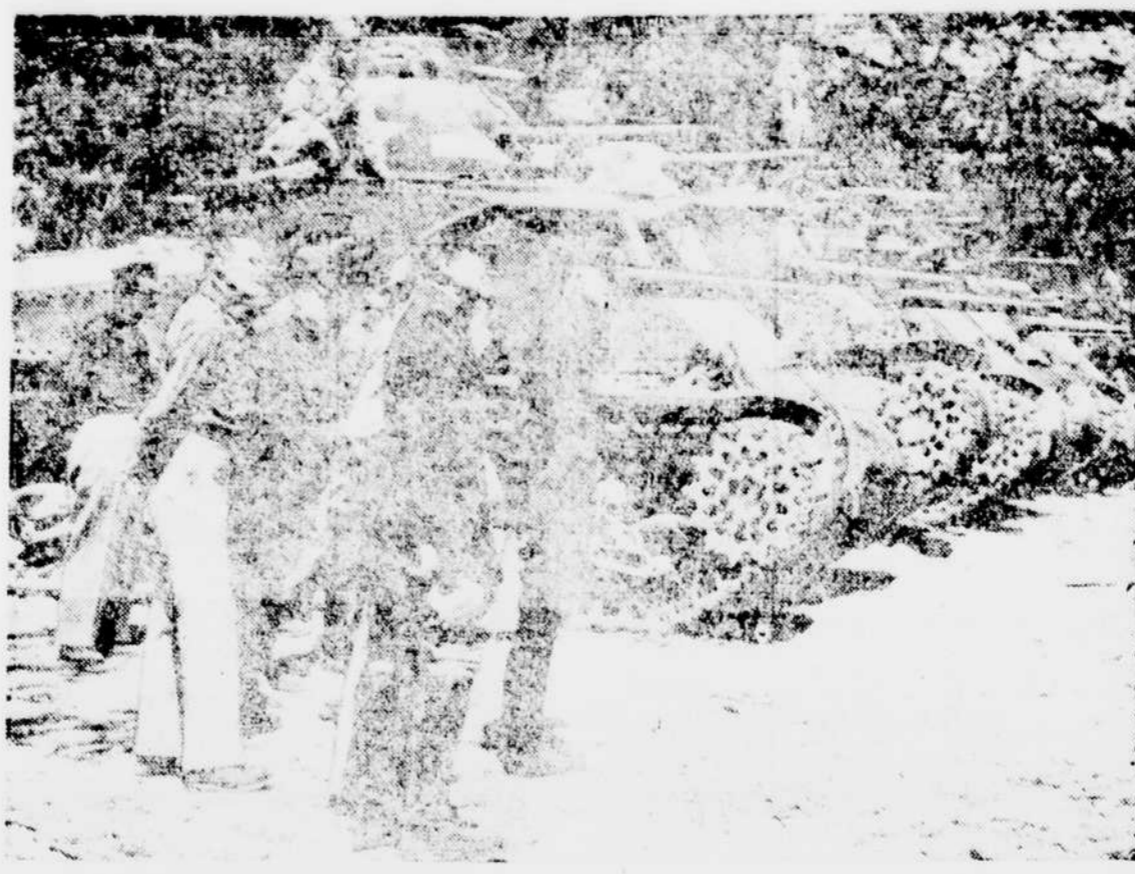

Cassarian Birth at Bronx Zoo



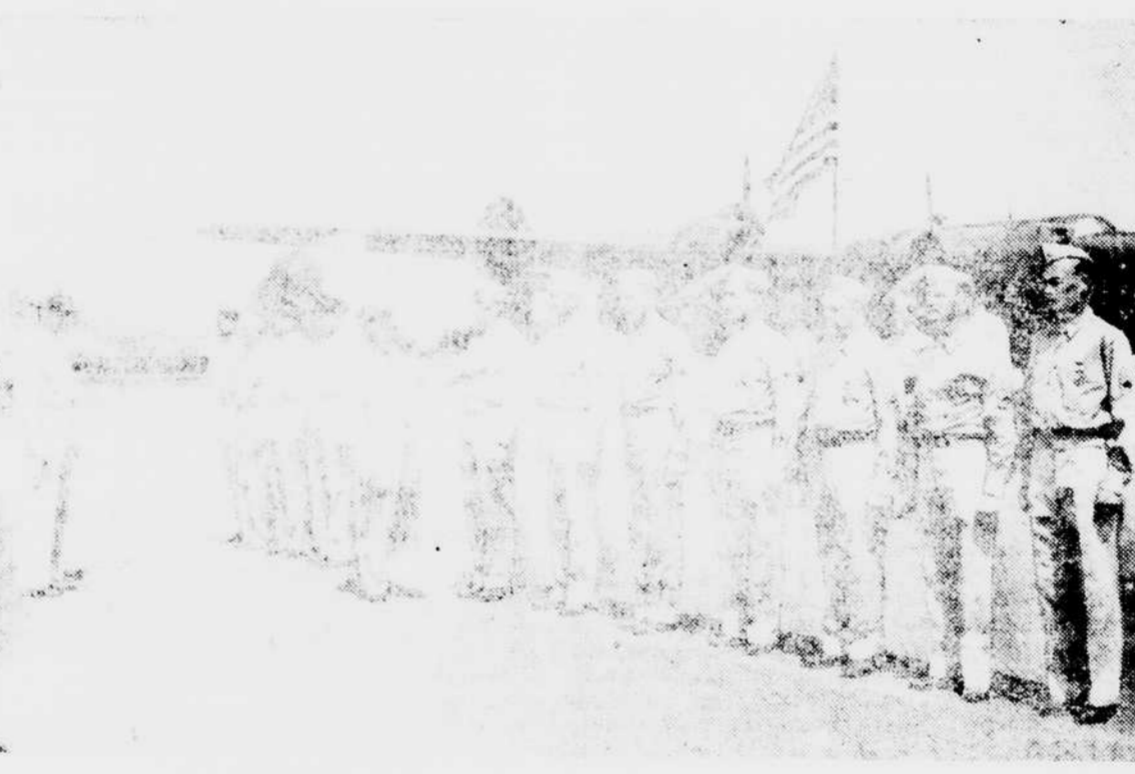

Decorate Members of Bomber Ferry Command



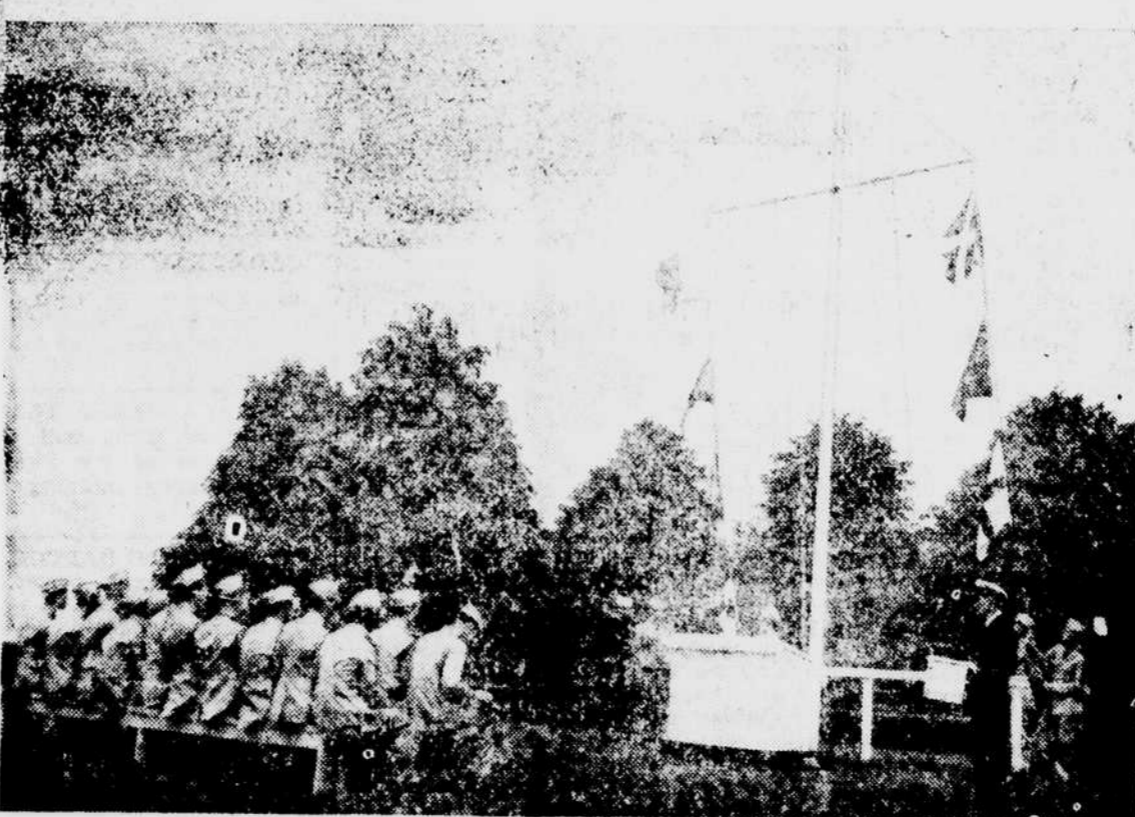

Believe It or Not—There Were No Casualties



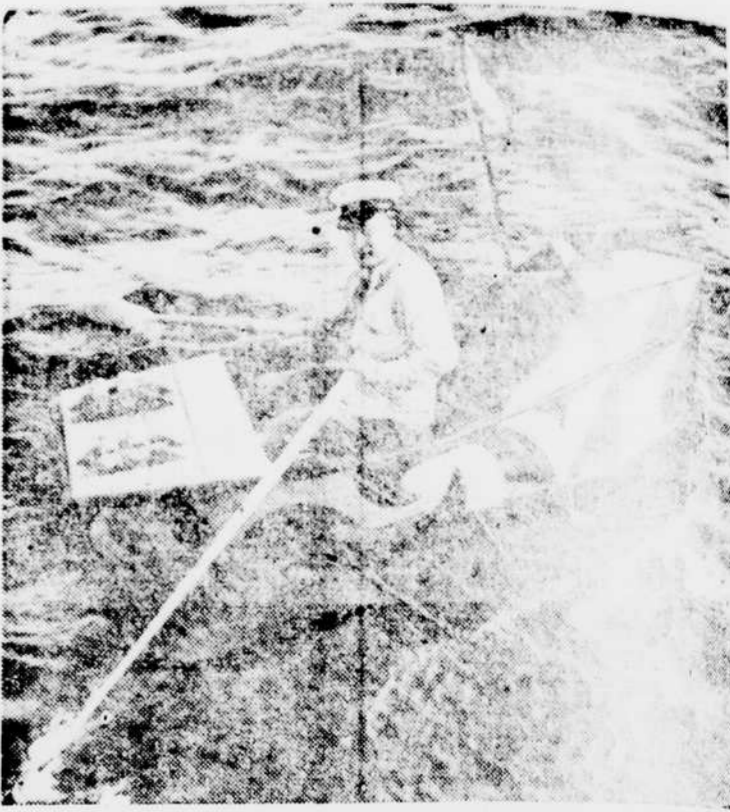
