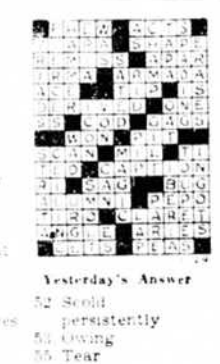

Boys Delivered to Invaders

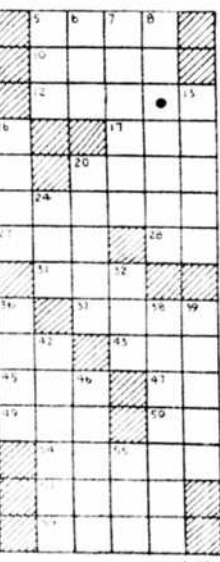
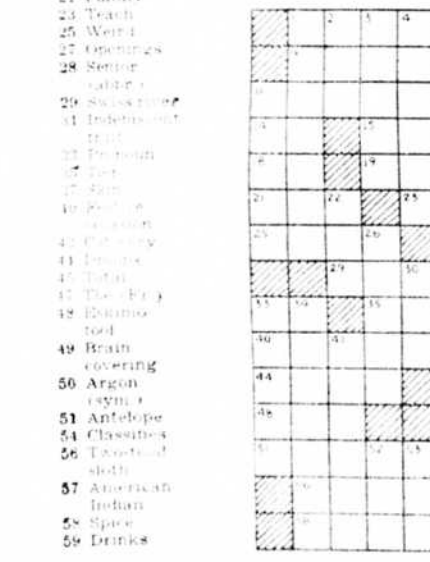
