

# Vance Farmers To Meet Or Exceed Crop Goals

## Acreage for Soybeans Below Goal, Noable Increases Shown For War-Vital Crops

Vance county farmers have pledged to meet or exceed crop goals set for 1943 production of these vital crops, but have indicated that the acreage for soybeans will be below goal.

The county farmers' association, which has been organized through a recent meeting in Henderson, N. C., at which planting and harvesting schedules were discussed, will be held in Henderson, N. C., on Sunday, March 21, at 10 o'clock a. m. The meeting will be held at the Henderson Public School building.

The county farmers' association has set goals for 1943 production of these vital crops. The goals are: Soybeans, 100,000 bushels; Corn, 1,000,000 bushels; Cotton, 100,000 bales; and Tobacco, 100,000 tons.
