### Bottom on Auto Bans

The House today passed a bill to amend the National Motor Vehicle Act of 1917, which would allow states to license their own automobiles without having to pass through the federal government. The bill was passed by a vote of 300 to 100.

The bill is expected to be signed into law by the president in the next few days. It would give states the authority to issue their own licenses and titles for automobiles, and to collect their own taxes on them.

This move is seen as a step toward decentralizing the federal government's control over the automobile industry. It would also give states more flexibility in setting their own regulations for vehicle safety and emissions.

General Bennett said that the Turkish government has been approached by the Axis powers, but they have refused their offers. He said that the Turkish government is now firmly committed to the Allied cause.

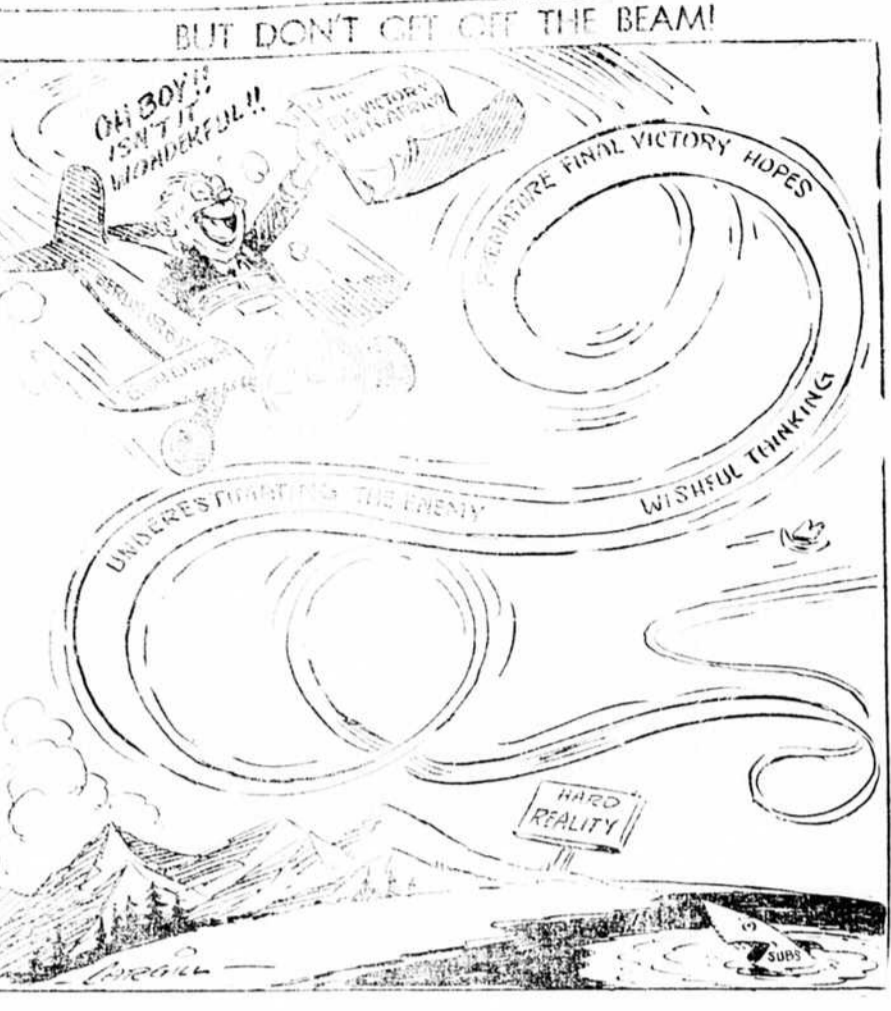
