### The Lights Are Green

Secretary Morgenthau made a good case for the Second War Loan and the government finances generally in his appeal in New York last night for the current war financing now under way. He made many statements which all of us will have to accept on the basis of his word for it, for of ourselves we know little about it.

The Treasury head stated that the government will borrow approximately seventy billion dollars this year, in addition to some thirty billions to be raised from taxes in the first four months of 1943 followed by twenty-five billions in the second four months of 1943, and about the same amount in the final period. These large sums include regular monthly bond sales quotas, payroll savings and the war loans, including funds from all borrowing sources.

In his speech the secretary assured the country that the second front is not a military secret. Just over the horizon, said he, we of the United Nations are plugging up the thunder-bolts of the greatest attack in history, and we are musing now for that attack. The planning and preparation, "the bitter time when we had to take blows without returning them, because we weren't ready—all of that is past." The lights are green, he assured, "will mean that Germany is its rotten, blood-stained foundations."

The best equipment ever furnished to any army is being purchased by the United States government for its forces, the secretary asserted, and all of this calls for money. The money could be raised through taxes, but that would not be with fairness on so large a scale. The money could be borrowed from the banks, but "your credit is excellent," but this is undesirable from economic and social standpoints, and after all this is a people's war and the people should have a part in financing it.

The only other source is through sale of bonds to the people as a whole. That is what the second war loan is undertaking to do. And that is why it should and why it must succeed. It is the best way of raising the bill. No true American would wish his fighting men to have other than the very best equipment that money can buy.

The Second War Loan drive is in progress. It offers various kinds of securities. There is a bond to fit every need and every purpose, and the variety makes it possible to please all customers. Some, perhaps many, among us will be unable to buy as we wish to do. For this is the saddest predicament in all the world. But there are many others who do have money—more than they have ever had in their lives before. They can be highly patriotic in this case.

It is both a request and an opportunity. And at the same time provides a backing for requirements when the lights go on again all over the world, and we shall launch out into new and greater volumes of trade and business than ever before. The lights are green ahead.

### The Salary Rider

The President naturally does not like the check given him in Congress on the \$25,000 salary limitation. How much of the sentiment prompted Capitol Hill to nullify the President's order stemmed from objection to salary limitation and how much from the feeling that he had gone too far in using his powers is more or less an open question. For our own part we think the chief executive's defiance of Congress is a more serious affair than to say how much or how little salary any individual may be entitled to.

If we remember correctly, the President asked for this limitation last year and Congress refused it, whereupon Mr. Roosevelt took the bull by the horns and proceeded to issue the edict on his own responsibility. That did not, of course, please the law-makers. We think there is logic in the theory that Congress should have called a spade a spade by dealing with the salary limitation separately and on its own merits rather than tying it into the debt limitation bill. From the standpoint of practical politics, though, the House and Senate were surer of attaining their objective by the procedure followed. They had good reason to suppose the President would not veto the debt limitation measure, so they lacked the salary bill to that, in the full knowledge that the President could not separate the two by approving the one and rejecting the other. They must have been convinced he would have vetoed the salary bill if it reached him as a separate enactment, and that would have necessitated the arduous effort to pass it over his veto.

### What Do You Know About North Carolina?

1. How many states pay their governors larger salaries than North Carolina?

2. What taxes were farmers required to pay the Confederate government as war taxes in 1863?

3. How many employees did the State Highway and Public Works Commission cut out during the fiscal year ending June 1942?

4. When was it proposed to change the name of the Civil War by a constitutional amendment?

5. What is the average value of North Carolina farm homes?

6. Why did Holke Smith, of Georgia, leave the United States Senate in 1941 after he was elected?

Answers:

1. Eight states pay their governors higher salaries than North Carolina (California, Connecticut, Illinois, Louisiana, and Texas each pay salaries of \$12,000 per year; and Nevada, which pays \$14,000; Pennsylvania, \$18,000; New Jersey, \$20,000; and New York, \$25,000).

2. Farmers were required to turn over to the Confederate government one-tenth of ten percent of their crops for that year. This included all kinds of crops—wheat, corn, rice, oats, beans, soybeans, peas, beans, potatoes, hay, buckwheat, and all other products, molasses, sugar, wool, pork, etc. Before deducting the ten percent, however, farmers were allowed to hold out 50 bushels of sweet potatoes, fifty bushels of corn, or ten bushels of wheat. They were exempted from delivering ten percent as taxes to any depot established within eight miles of the farm.

3. The budget report to the legislature listed a total of 1,136 employees in the department in 1941. These had been reduced to 837 in 1942. The total salaries were reduced from \$8,340,000 in 1941 to \$8,000,000 in 1942. More drastic reductions have been

made since the end of the fiscal year in 1942.

4. A movement was sponsored in 1937 by the U. S. D. to amend a constitutional amendment changing the name of the Civil War to the "War Between the States." This proposed amendment, with several others, came before the legislature. Governor Craig was authorized to appoint a constitutional commission to consider these and other changes in the constitution. A total of eight amendments were proposed by this commission. No effort was made to put this report into effect.

5. The United States census of 1940 for North Carolina placed farm homes at an average value of \$2,974 each.

6. Holke Smith was elected to Governor of Georgia when he was elected to the United States Senate on July 12, 1941, to fill a vacancy. He said that he preferred to continue in government, which he did until the 31st of January, 1942. He was then elected to the Senate on Nov. 10, 1942, and completed the term which began in 1943. He was elected and served until 1942 when he refused having been defeated by the opposition to succeed him.
