

# **Axis Attacks** Hurled Back Before City

Fighting is Fiercest Since Egypt; Allies Open Big Offensive To Crack Rommel

Allied Headquarters in North Africa, April 21—(AP)—Dash-ing veterans of the eighth army bave captured Enfidaville, axis coastal anchor 50 miles south of Tunis, in the first hours of an offensive to crack the enemy's Tunisian corner and have hurled back four axis counter at-tacks in some of the fiercest fighting since the nazis were thrown out of Egypt, the allies
