Washington, May 14—(AP)—The Senate rejected, 57 to 21, today an amendment to the pay-as-you-go revenue bill to credit current payments against this year's income and collect the full 1942 tax in ten semi-annual installments beginning next March 15.

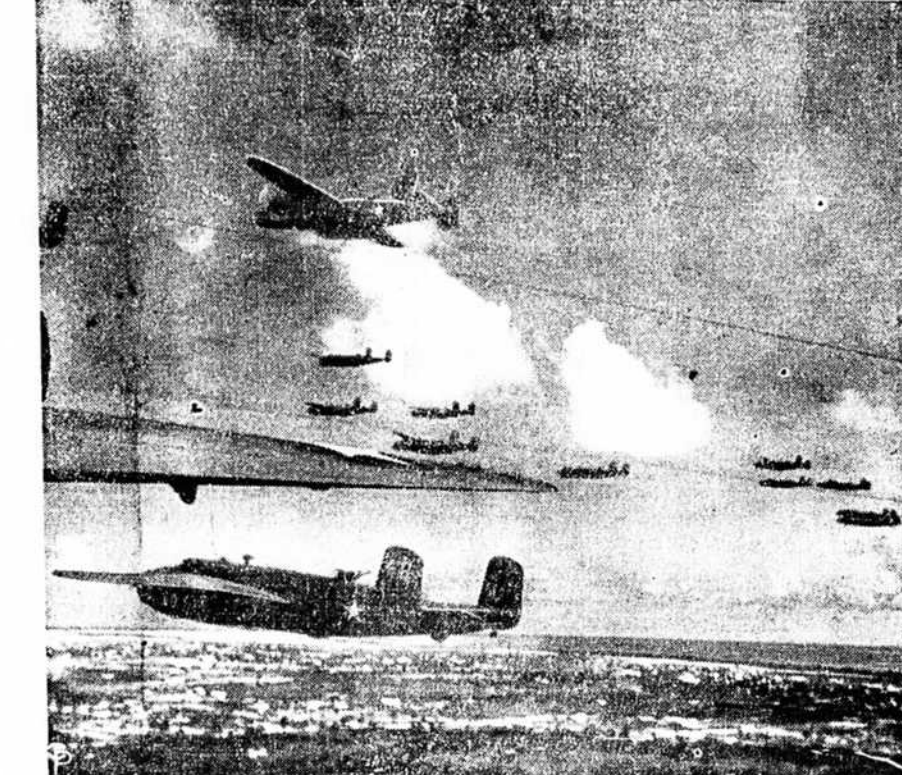
Mussolini Expels Six More Leaders
