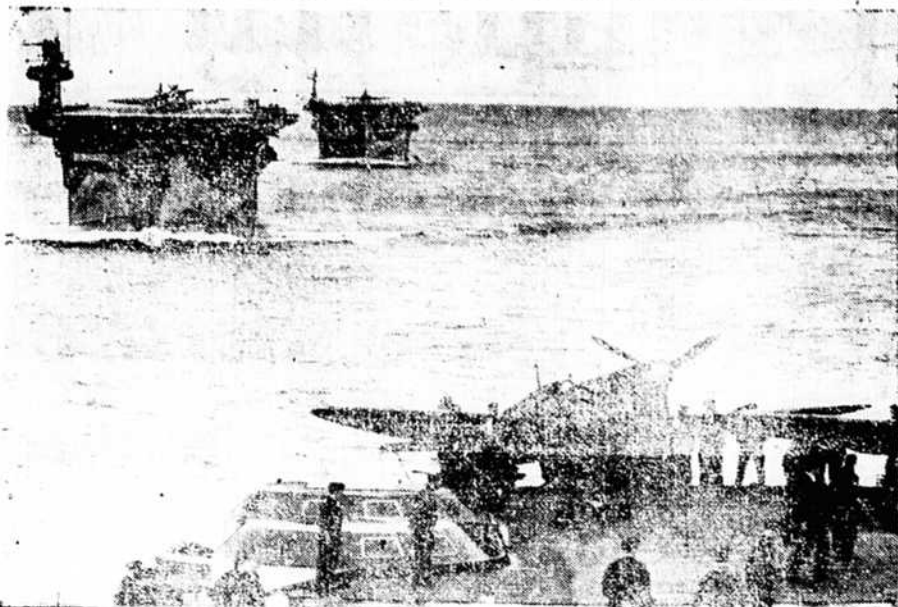


ESCORT CARRIERS USED FOR CONVOY PROTECTION

The rest of the western hemispherical Latins, he points out, concentrate so much authority in the executive branches of their various governments that their respective presidents can act in such matters without consulting their 20 different legislative bodies. Even the Argentine's foremost magistrate could have done so if he had wished, but he is rated, among his own countrymen, as being decidedly more pro-German and pro-Italian (though not pro-Japanese) than the rank and file of them.

Brazil is predominantly Pro-American, therefore pro-Yankee. Argentina is strongly Latin, but is not more than nominally pro-Italian, either. The German infusion is strong in the Argentine republic. It is in Chile also. Germans broke in there in early colonial days and are formidable. Still, they are in no majority. Italians never gained much of a Chilean stronghold, though, it was too far inland for them.

The emergency group discussed of how about the future? Chile especially has mineral supplies required by Yankee industry. What tariff conditions will it get then? President Rios' visit is to bond the Americans closer together. His visit to Washington is, therefore, highly important. It almost overbrowses the recent visit of Prime Minister Winston Churchill.
