Italeigh, June 17.—The 1943 statute imposes mandatory revocation of license 1 r any dealer convicted of selling beer of wine between the heats of 11:30 p m, and 7 a, m, and neither the court nor any other person or agency has any discretion in the matter, according to opinion of Att rivey General Harry McMullar released for publication today.
