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

Defending the Navy

Assistant Attorney General Frank Murphy, attorney for the Navy Department, has been called to the Navy Department to consider surprising White House officials with a surprise announcement that he would resign if the administration did not do more to help the Navy. Mr. Murphy, who has been a member of the Senate Select Committee on Naval Affairs since 1937, has been asked to resign by President Roosevelt, who has been told that he would be succeeded by a member of the Senate Select Committee on Naval Affairs.

Murphy's resignation was expected to be accepted by the president.

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PEACEKEEPING IN WEAKNESS

A policy of appeasement is a con-

dition of weakness. If a "bully" is appeased, he will continue to "bully." He must be belittled.

This piece of knowledge that all of us learned in our school days applies to national policies and international diplomacy, as well as to individual boys and men.

Consider the case of England since 1920. Following her traditional foreign policy she wanted a balance of power among the great nations on the continent of Europe. She failed to stop France in realistic policy toward Germany until it was too late because she felt it was to her advantage to have a nation powerful enough to act as a buffer state between communistic Russia and a democratic and unified France. When the mistake of this policy was perceived, the second mistake was made—APPEASEMENT. Instead of using the military might of Britain to stop Hitler, she allowed him to expand his territory and to conquer Poland, Norway, France and many British colonies. Now she is faced with the possibility of a second world war.

APPEASEMENT had not been the only mistake. Hitler's aggression was

the result of the military and economic

successes he had won over the little countries he had taken.

He had realized that AP-
