Heavy Force Of Bombers Raids Valley

Nearly 30,000 Tons of Bombs Dropped on Ruhr Area During Massive Attacks

London, June 26—(AP)—A heavy force of British bombers spread new destruction last night in the German Ruhr, hit-ting targets in Bochum and Gelsentirehen, and one military ob-server declared that neutralizing of this great industrial val-

ley was near completion.

This observer, who cannot be identified by name, estimated that nearly 30,000 tons of bombs, many of them blockbusters, had been east upon this compact nazi industrial region since the massive hombing expanion.

The normal industrial haze over the Ruhr is now reported thinned at 5rd is said, in fact, to have actually disappeared in some places. During the three and one-half months period, more than 500 bomisers have been lost, this source said, and same 3,000 men have been killed or captured.
