Funeral services for L. T. Mitchell, 78-year-old farmer of the Kittrell community of Vance county, died at 12:25 a. m. today at his home, following a three-week illness of a combination of ailments.

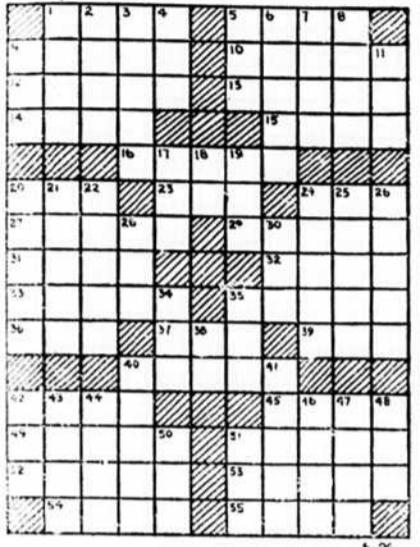

The pest that has been causing the most damage to tobacco plants is the tobacco hornworm. ...

The entomologist suggested that one pound of crystals be mixed with ten gallons of water. When a spray is desired, and that this mixture should be applied to the crop at the rate of 80 to 100 gallons per acre.

He further suggested that applications of the insecticide be made at five to seven day intervals until control is obtained. Any application of the insecticide should be made within 24 hours, should be repeated as soon as possible.
