Republic Steel Interested In Tar Heel Sponge Iron

In The Sir Walter Hotel, Daily Dispatch Bureau, By LYNN NISBET

Raleigh, June 29—High officials of the Republic Steel Company last week visited Governor Broughton that they are greatly interested in possibilities of sponge iron development in this state and offered full cooperation of their laboratories and other facilities in preliminary tests.

Government officials interested in promoting development of the iron potentials in this state still recognize that the big job is to get the processing done at the mines. Some good would be accomplished by recovering the ore and shipping it to distant plants for conversion and refining, but that is not their chief aim.

The Brassert process involved in the Warren, Ohio, plant is believed to provide the answer. Old time blast furnace operations are ruled out because of excessive cost. A blast furnace with accessory equipment runs up to fifty or sixty million dollars. The Brassert sponge iron process requires investment of approximately one million. Prospect for location of one or two of these plants in North Carolina is not as remote as it seemed a few months ago.
