Business Men Predominate On Unified Hospital Board

Raleigh, July 9.—With possible exception of the State board of education which was named three months ago, there was more general interest in the unified board of control for State mental institutions than in any other board appointments to be made by Governor Broughton under his plan.

The board of the board as announced Thursday held some surprises. It includes only one member of the investigating committee which last year went thoroughly into the organization situation and whose recommendations were embodied in the statute authorizing a control board for all institutions. That is Dr. W. G. Clark of Winston-Salem.

It is interesting to note that business men predominate in the appointive membership, seven of the 15 being so named. Further broken down they include three merchants, two mercantile-farmers, one banker and one bonded warehouse operator. There are four doctors, one lawyer and three women.

The board will meet in the governor's office Friday, July 16, to be sworn in. In addition to the 15 appointive members, the statute names the secretary of the State board of health, currently Dr. Carl V. Reynolds, as ex officio member. The board also must appoint a full time business manager and a full time psychiatrist as superintendent of mental hygiene.

Large staffs required appointment of four men and one woman from the middle and western parts of the state and provided for staggered appointments of one to five years, with all subsequent appointments for three-year terms.
