Delays in Shipping Surgical Dressing Material Explained

The following letter was recently received by Mrs. B. A. Scott, chairman of the Red Cross surgical dressing room in Vance county from Mrs. Cordelia D. Wolf, administrator of the Volunteer Service, Eastern Area, and will help to explain the delay in the shipment of surgical dressings here. The letter follows:

Some shipments of surgical dressings material have been delayed in reaching Chapters. This has brought about long distance telephone calls, telegrams, and letters urging our stations to speed up delivery. This delay is of grave concern to the Eastern Area Office because we realize the importance of the surgical dressings program.

National Headquarters has brought this matter to the attention of the Surgeon General, as the shipment of materials are handled by the War Department. A check will be made by that office with the manufacturers, and we hope this will expedite shipments. Many problems exist in manufacturers, labor conditions, and inadequate transportation facilities which make it difficult for them to fulfill contracts entered into last year. This is a situation we will have to face, probably for the duration, and we hope your plans can be adjusted accordingly.

Should it become necessary to close your warehouse due to the high cost of materials, please give prior notice of such action so we will be ready and willing to give increased credit when we can be released. The program is designed to make work for volunteers, but the ultimate goal is to keep up adequate stock of completed dressings in the medical depots to meet the needs of the Army at all times.
