

Schools Here Will Open On Thursday, September 2

Earliest Opening in Years, Due to Addition of Ninth Month, Teachers Meet Earlier

Public schools of Henderson and Vance counties, both white and colored, are to open their fall semester on Thursday, September 2, a week earlier than heretofore, Superintendent E. M. Rollins announced today.

The earlier opening comes about by reason of addition of the ninth month this year for the first time since the State has maintained the school year on this basis. That the school year of 1943-44 will be shorter than that of 1942-43 is due to the fact that the State will have two 15-day school terms in the month of August.

Teachers will meet on Wednesday, August 11, at 7:30 p. m. at the Henderson High School to discuss the new schedule.
