Cotton Mills Will Suspend For Holiday

Employees of the Henderson and Harriet cotton mills will have a three-day vacation including the Labor Day holiday, it was learned today. The mills will suspend operations at 11 p. m. Friday and resume work at 11 p. m. Tuesday.

The time off is understood to be part of the annual week of vacation which is granted to employees under their union contract with the operators.

The Carolina Bagging Co. plant will suspend work on Monday only, it was stated by an official of the company.

The Henderson post office will observe holiday hours, with the general delivery and stamp window open only from 10 a. m. until 11 a. m., and no deliveries made either in the city or on rural routes. Mail will be dispatched to trains and incoming mail will be worked to post office boxes.

All three Henderson banks will be closed throughout the day. The Continental Hosiery Co. plant will operate through Labor Day, as will the tobacco plants in the city. Information as to whether the Co. would close was not available today.

Business offices and stores throughout the city are expected to remain open on Labor Day, but no public observance of the holiday is expected to be made here.

ABC Board Won't Buy Liquor Now

The Vance County ABC Board refused to contract for a year's supply of whisky because it was unwilling to pay the American Distilling Company a deposit of ten dollars per case in advance of deliveries, Chairman George A. Rose, Sr., of the board, said today. Mr. Rose said the board had discussed the distillers' offer with the county commissioners, and there was general agreement not to go into the arrangement.

According to the State ABC Board, Vance was the only one of the 25 liquor counties in the State which refused to enter into the contract, and officials of the State board are now in Chicago arranging for the deal. The contract was approved by the State attorney general.

Although a deposit of ten dollars a case would be required by the American Distilling Company, deliveries would be made only on order and at intervals during the year. Mr. Rose said Vance county would have been required to contract for 6,000 cases, and at \$10 that would have amounted to \$60,000 that would have been deposited with the company. He said he and the board could see no reason for any such arrangement. The local board, he added, is getting all the liquor it wants and is finding no difficulty in keeping up its stocks.

Signing of a contract for 170,000 cases for the State board would not have affected the present rationing system, it is said. During July sales in the 25 wet counties were reported in the aggregate of less than 27,000 cases, compared with 55,000 in July, 1942, according to the State board.
