

# Governor To Open War Fund Drive With Address Here

Broughton to Speak At High School on Next Monday Evening

Governor Broughton will open Vance county's United War Fund drive with an address in the auditorium of Henderson high school next Monday evening at 8 o'clock. J. W. Jenkins, county chairman, announced today. The governor has accepted an invitation to attend the meeting and to speak.

With him will be also, it is expected, George P. Hood, State bank commissioner, and vice chairman of the State War Fund; General George P. Geoghegan, of the Wachovia Bank & Trust Company in Raleigh, who is chairman of the eighth district in the war fund campaign.

Vance county will be asked for \$20,000 in the campaign this year, including approximately \$10,000 for the Vance County Community Chest.

At the Monday night meeting the governor will be introduced by B. H. Perry, well known Henderson attorney. The local company of the State Guard and the industry band are to participate by parading through the business section and to the auditorium just before the speaker.

All civic clubs and women's groups are being requested this week to attend the meeting in a body. Ward and township leaders will have reserved seats at the meeting. Ministers are requested to announce the meeting from their pulpits next Sunday.

General Jenkins will preside at the meeting and George M. Hood and also present Mr. Geoghegan for a brief explanation of the purposes of the nationwide drive in which

the county at large is expected to raise \$125,000,000.

Governor Broughton, Mr. Hood and Mr. Geoghegan are to be guests of the executive committee of the campaign at dinner at the Vance hotel prior to the high school rally. Following the governor's address all leaders and workers are to separate into groups for distribution of their campaign cards, and the advance gift committee will begin its work on Tuesday morning of next week. The campaign proper gets under way Monday, October 25, and runs through that week.

## Baptists To Send Group To Association

A large delegation from the First Baptist church here will go to the annual session of the Tar River Baptists tomorrow at Mt. Zion church in Franklin county, and the local church will make one of the best reports in its history.

Rev. E. Norfleet Gardner, pastor of the local church, is clerk of the association, and F. E. Pinnell, of Henderson, is vice moderator. Mrs. W. W. Parker, of the local church, is superintendent of women's work in the association.

Contrary to custom, the association will be held only one day, with morning, afternoon and evening sessions. Attendance may be continued by transportation difficulties.

Henderson First church will report a membership of 1,900, with a Sunday school enrollment of 1,025, and 52 in the Baptist Training Union and 333 enrolled in the Womans' Missionary Union.

Total gifts for the year will be reported as \$10,499.38. Thus figure includes \$11,499.26 for local expenses and \$6,099.26 for missions and benevolences. Gifts to the orphanage, embraced in the latter figure, amounted to \$800.14, together with an item of \$700.00 for the Immanuel clinic. The average amount paid for the year is stated as being \$16.16.

Several State leaders are on the program for the association meeting: treatment here under five years of
