In and out during October were 37 prisoners, and they served a total of 217 jail days.

Prices were slightly firmer on the Prices were slightly firmer on the Henderson tobacco market when auctions were resumed today after the honday which became efective at the close of selling Taesday of last week, on orders of Governer Brougaton and Governor Darden of Virginia, affecting all flue-cured markets in the two states.

Arthur H. Surprise, sales apprevisor, said approximately 400,000 pounds of tobacco were sold during the day, and that a slight block of warehouse floors was left over at the end of the selling period.

Surprise said that prices improved slightly as the day wore on, but at the opening were about the same as at the close before for the balday. He estimated that lend-leade buyers were more active today, and that they were taking more of the common grades, which showed some strength.
