High Court Rules Upon Liquor Case

(Continued from Page One) sentenced to six months or \$50 fine. He appealed to Superior Court.

Meantime, the grand jury returned a true bill of indictment against him, under which he was tried, convicted and sentenced to just twice as much as the recorder had given him.

In the superior court the defendant also moved for dismissal on the ground that evidence failed to show he had the liquor for sale. That was the salient point, and when it came to the final court on appeal left no escape from passing definitely on it.

Justice Williams writes at length from the Tarleton Act, the controlling statute in legislation passed to punish the act in 1937. He also writes from the latter. He finds some inconsistencies and contradictions, but concludes that the general purpose did not intend any such result as results from saying it is not the possession of liquor for sale, but that it is held for resale, and in another permitting any person to transport from an ABC store liquor from outside the State into the jurisdiction of liquor for sale.

Consequently, it is held that the motion for dismissal in superior court should have been allowed and the ruling of the lower court is reversed. That means that Jack Sotherly has been and it also determines the same for future trials involving the same or closely similar cases.

The superior court also upheld the state's demand toward and North Carolina highway in their compliance with the prohibition. It is held that in that country should be held as a violation, rather than as an operating license for tax purposes.

Hints Given to Taxpayers By Babson

(Continued from Page One) plower would probably be obliged to pay a tax of 50 percent to 75 percent of his net income. This reduces the value of the business to the employer and causes him to sell it much cheaper than if these heavy taxes did not exist.

Before the Federal taxes went into effect a man could die and leave his business outright to his family as the death taxes were very small. Today, however, in a great many cases the family is compelled to sell a part interest in the business in order to secure funds to pay the death taxes.

When a taxpayer last December sold securities at a profit, he was obliged to pay 25 percent in taxes on net profit. This December, however, if his 1943 income is larger than his 1942 income he is obliged to pay a tax of only 25 percent of said 25 percent as the government "forgives" 75 percent of either 1942 or 1943, whichever is the smaller.
