Tar Heels In All-Southern Bid Saturday

Chapel Hill, Nov. 25.—The North Carolina eleven, which stands No. 13 in one of the leading national grid football today, for several years and will be making their final bid for All-Southern against Virginia in Norfolk Saturday.

One almost sure shot is Hosen Rodgers, 200-pound fullback. Coach George Minter said he was the "best I ever had met", Army and Navy included, and his own coaches say he could "make any eleven in the country."

The Tar Heels will take their final drill today and leave by bus at noon Friday. Contact will be at Foreman field at 2 o'clock Saturday, and a near-capacity crowd is expected to see the old rivals resume their feud.

Rodgers is leading the whole club in total scoring and rushing, but George Grimes, the ex-Virginia star

who has been selected as Carolina's leading captain against his old mates, has the No. 1 advantage with 612 yards per year.

Grimes, who incidentally passed for both the Virginia scores on Carolina's first year, has warned the Tar Heels' supporters this week that they will need to be at their best against the Cavaliers.

"They have one of the best receivers in Virginia," he pointed out today. "In fact, their one college loss in the State was to Richmond. I know how they get legged up for Carolina, and I know they'll be right again Saturday."

Other leading bats for All-Southern include Jack Fitch, who scored on Tech twice saved the team against Radon Strayhorn and Eddie Grimes, ex-All-Southern Southern guard and tackle, Billy Meyer, who scored on Duke and Virginia, Barney Power, 240-pound end, and Ulysses Cornog, 60-minute tackle.

George Hodges, 210-pound tackle from Norfolk, who did some of the work against Duke last week, is the only Virginia boy on the squad besides Grimes, but Red Jones, utility lineman, is from nearby Edinboro.

This will be Carolina's first appearance in Norfolk since 1929. The Tar Heels' record at V. P. I. last year was a 1-1 record and a new attendance mark of 26,000. V. P. I. and Virginia met in Norfolk last year.
