MAXTON SCHEDULES MANY YULE EVENTS

Maxton, Dec. 22.—A full bill of events—has been arranged for the entertainment of military personnel at the LaGrange-Maxton army air base during the Christmas holidays. Stage shows, dances, Christmas carols, parties and open houses are on the program.

"Jolly Times," a USO-camp show, will play the stage of the base theatre Christmas night. Another USO show unit will appear Monday at the base hospital and recreation halls.

Christmas Eve, about eleven, the 364th army air forces band will tour the base singing carols. A community sing is booked for the same night at the theater.

"Tinies," a local dance, are scheduled on the program by towns. The annual LaGrange Legion held its annual Christmas with one Western Carolina Maxton USO club on the base. Thursday night a big base dance will be held at recreation hall. The New Year's Day dance will be at Washington December 29, at the Legion Hall Club and New Year's Day at Legion Hall.

ARTHUR ASSUMES DUTIES AT DAVIS

Camp Davis, Dec. 22.—Col. D. Arthur, Jr., has assumed command of the artillery school at Camp Davis, a former training center for the 1st Armored Division. He succeeds Col. W. G. Glavin, Jr., who has assumed command of the AAA school at Camp Davis.
