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BARCLAY ON BRIDGE

CAN OVERDO ANYTHING NO MATTER how good an idea may be, overdoing it is possible. That is most definitely true of the "No Trump complex." All of the best players strongly prefer getting into "No Trump" games as compared to minor suit ones, as they require only one trick instead of 11. But when they carry this preference too far, they can even get themselves set in a No Trump game when a slam could be scored in a minor.

At the time of the post-mortem, a habitué of the North hand opined that if the suit which had been led had been a major instead of diamonds, North's cards would have justified an immediate jump to show strength, as the hand did have about enough power to guarantee 10 tricks. But since it was a minor in which 11 were needed, a single raise was enough at the start.

South's reverse bid then of 2-Hearts made North able to jump to "assume" game. Since South's hand was somewhat stronger than indicated, the Blackwooding and slam contract would have been justified. The slam was of course made, with the loss of only a spade trick.

In a rubber game, the bidding on this deal was exactly as given in the first example. After South's 2-Hearts, North bid only 4-Diamonds because he did not want to "take the bidding above the No Trump game level." South had done all of the real strength-adding up to that stage, and decided to gamble for game by shifting.

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FARMERS IN WARREN TO ATTEMPT QUOTAS

College Station, Raleigh, March 7. Farmers are upset over the recent changes in the draft rules. But will make every effort to produce needed crops and livestock, in spite of difficulties, from Warren county.

Every morning in 1944 crop and livestock made were held and the attendance was exceptionally good, according to the State College Extension representative. In the Northern community meeting 103 leading farm men and women were in attendance.

As a result of the meetings, the growers are rapidly applying top-dressing to their fields because they have learned that late applications of fertilizer do not give as large gains as that applied early.

The growers are also saving a relatively large acreage of land, which will be used for growing, hay, corn and soybeans, according to Dwight North Carolina now has more than a million acres of land in the second crop in the State from an average standpoint, exceeded only by Iowa.

Many growers are now planning to produce in their small farms as a means of saving labor. Following the harvesting of the cotton, growers are often forced to look for land where they put in other legumes.

Eighty percent of more than 100 fields of hybrid seed corn are being planted in Warren county, a local farmer reported. They are to make a survey of growing the hybrid corn. Many growers are now planting hybrid seed corn on a small scale in association with the N. C. Crop Improvement Association and State College specialists to check the results into a real basis in the near future.
