### War Official Lists Plans for Calling Draft Deferments

Washington, March 29.—(AP)—Under Secretary of War Robert P. Patterson told the House Military Committee today the time had arrived for 3,500,000 4-F's between the ages of 18 and 37, to be assigned to essential industry or to be inducted into the Army in labor battalions.

We live in a period during which Patterson said, in which the continental continent is at the maximum saturation. It is being quite plain that some method of control than the utilization of 3-F's in essential industries more extensively than under existing practice would promote the welfare of the war.

One method to utilize the 4-F's he explained, will be by enactment of national service registration legislation to men between 18 and 37 who have been classified as physically unable to perform military service. He said assignment of such men to essential activities could be under control of a director of national service.

Another method would be designation of the present 4-F's as non-essential workers and those 4-F's who were physically unable to serve as essential workers and deferred until the end of the war. This, he said, would be the other method, setting aside from the local bases of recruitment, too, so that they would be inducted and processed in central centers.

At the need for additional workers in an essential activity became evident, he explained, the men assigned to the selected reserve would be directed to local boards to take part, without in such activity, retaining their civilian status and receiving the wages of either ordinary employees or civilian employment.

Men sent into essential employment and refusing to go, he declared, would be called by the Army to active military service and would be used in special labor units.

### Reported Executed



ACCORDING to unconfirmed British press dispatches, Victor Orlando, 33, former Italian premier and one of the Allied "big four" at the Versailles conference, was among the 260 Italians executed in Rome. The report adds that the executions were carried out by the Nazis in reprisal for a bomb attack in Rome in which 24 Gestapo officers were killed. (International)

### Locals Will Decide Farm Deferments

#### Hoover Modifies Procedure Due to Senate Pressure

Washington, March 29.—(AP)—President Hoover has modified his farm deferment plan to give local boards more power to put into operation immediately. He said the effect of deferring "military needs" from farms which imperil war production."

Hoover said he received a telegram from Senator Wayne Morse, who, along with Senator Harry Truman, has introduced a Senate amendment to Congress, unanimous that he has had agreed to scrap the original plan, which had been the main point of contention.

Hoover said Senator Wayne Morse had told him that the Senate amendment, if adopted, would have the effect of deferring "military needs" from farms which imperil war production."
