



Jubilee Gets \$4,281 From **Duke Funds**

Jubilee hospital of Henderson, a colored institution, will receive \$4,281 from the Duke Endownent for char-ity patients treated during 1943, ac-cording to announcessent of the al-lotments, just made. Ninety-seven hospitals in all in the Carolin's shared the \$647,379.43 distribution voted by the trustees of the endow-ment at a meeting in New York Wednesday. All appropriations were on the basis of the mytution's char-ity work in 1943. The distributions are made annually under terms of a trust established by the late James B. Duke, tobacco magnate, and u native of Durham. Jubilee hospital of Henderson.
