Jap Thrust Into India New Cause Of Concern

Washington—Japan's drive into India is causing considerable concern in Washington, although it still is in its formative stage and there are high hopes that Lord Louis Mountbatten and his Allied forces may soon stop the Mikado's men and turn them back into Burma.

The Japanese reverting to their strategy of the early days of the war, are utilizing their superlative knowledge of jungle tactics and fighting methods, infiltrating toward India's teeming population of more than 200 millions.

A political weapon will be wielded by the Japanese if they ever get into the populous section of the sub-continent—a weapon which the masses in India, for the most part, are too ignorant to resist.

Reports that Carlton J. E. Hayes, United States ambassador to Spain, is coming home indicates in Washington that the administration is anxious to review its relations with Generalissimo Francisco Franco before the impending European election begins.

For some months, the State Department has been inundated with charges that the United States has refused the Spanish isolationists, oil and other commodities. Although promptly denied, the charges were so insistent that the patient State Department to warn Spain that it would tolerate no underhanded dealings with the Axis.

Finally, the United States issued a "strong" memorandum asking Spain to explain why it was permitting diplomatic immunity in Tangiers across the straits of Gibraltar.

Hayes' reported recall is the latest incident in America's tug-of-war position in Spain's relations with Spain. Washington observers are skeptical as to whether El Caudillo may align Spain with the Allies. They feel that the United States has failed to make sure that Franco, with many Axis sympathies, will not cooperate much more than the big power nations.
