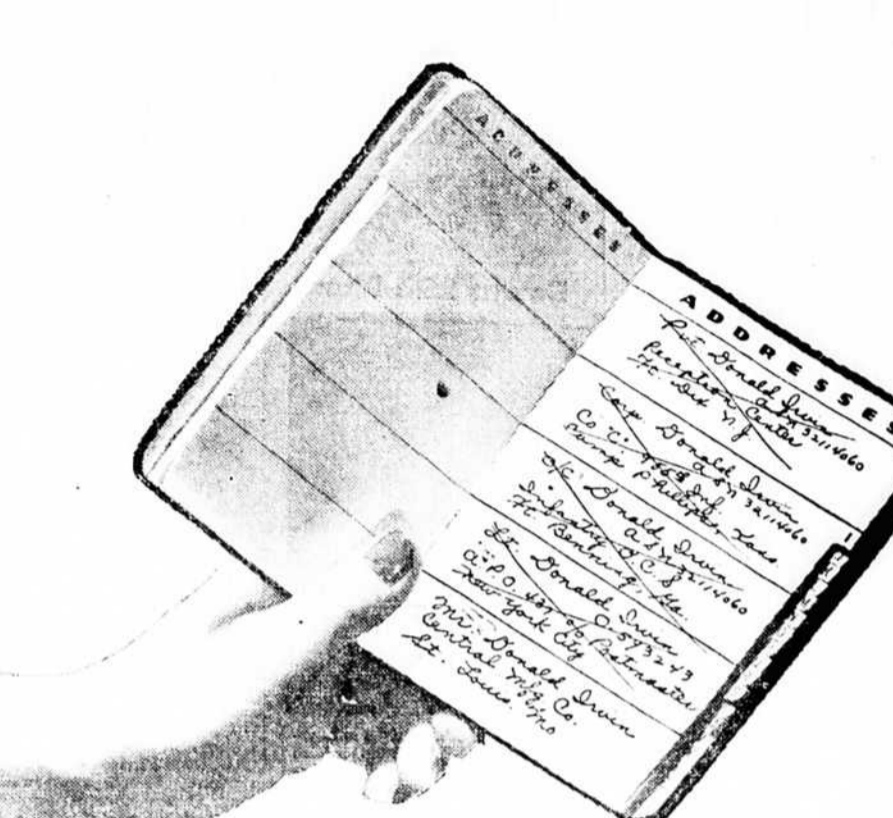
MARRIAGE LICENSES GO TO TWO COUPLES

The Great Milt is known for his extraordinary muscular build and control, which earned him the nickname, the "Miracle Muscle Man." Sandor Szabo, not so well known, is nevertheless a formidable mat foe.
