Speaking for the South, Mrs. McNeill, of North Carolina, said: "We are assembled here today in a shrine sacred to the North and South alike. It is almost fitting that these great centers of our Nation, once divided for many united, should in this momentous hour of world history join in a solemn pledge of unity and loyalty."
