

# Mayor Powell Asks For Full Support Of Fifth War Loan

County Chairman Says Invasion Makes  
Necessary Bigger Purchases Than Ever

Mayor Henry T. Powell, who is a committee man for the Fifth War Loan, drove here today made an appeal to all citizens to support the campaign as they have never before done in the history of the national loan drives.

He stressed the slogan "Buy More than Before."

Every bond bought in the past undoubtedly played a part in bringing the war to an earlier end, he said, and now the more bonds are bought the fewer American lives will be lost.

"Unless we make the supreme effort to do everything humanly possible either at our work or in homes, or with our dollars, we are handing over one share of the burden to our fighting men," he said.

The campaign began throughout the nation last Monday, and an organization has already been set up here to urge the drive in Vance county. The head quota is \$1,400,000.

The women's division, under direction of Mrs. A. W. Gilliam, organized its program last Monday night in an dinner meeting. Merchants are also cooperating as are the civic clubs and other units.

The mayor's appeal on County Chairman follows in full:

The Fifth War Loan starts Monday June 12, and there will be a feeling of shame in this community if we find ourselves still of our goal when the Fifth War Loan comes to an end next month.

## Recorder Has 27 Cases In Month Of May

State Agent Aids  
In Demonstration  
Of Terrace Work

Twenty-seven defendants were tried at Vance County recorder's court in May. It was shown in the monthly report of Superior Court Clerk E. O. Falliner today. There were fifteen convictions.

Eight of the 27 defendants were white men and three were white women, with 13 colored men and three colored women.

Fourteen defendants paid costs or fines and costs, four were found not guilty, and three won no fine pro actione and three had costs remitted. Possession of case was found in one instance in which the defendant was bound over to superior court. One was found to jail and one to juvenile court.

Nine or exactly one-third of the 27 cases charged with some form of anti-war law violation. Three were charged with public drunkenness, two each with public drunkenness for sale and possession of whisky paid whisky for sale, and one each with drunken driving and possession of home brew for sale.

Three defendants were charged with operating a motor vehicle with no proper license, two each with speeding and resisting an officer in performance of duty and with assault. One defendant each was charged with abandonment and non-payment of alimony, giving a worthless check, disorder, trespass, reckless driving, assault with a deadly weapon, failing to take treatment for tuberculosis, and breaking and entering and larceny and receiving.

The 27 cases tried last month compared with 14 in May last year and 42 in April this year. It was the record number of cases for any month in 1944 thus far.
