

Crop Insurance Plan Is Receiving New Support

Legion Told GI Benefits Not Enough

Fight on FEPC Is Looming as Check To Speedy Recess

Washington, June 19.—(AP)—

A drive to revise and extend the dying Federal crop insurance program gained strong bipartisan support today, prompting senators to predict favorable congressional action this session.

The Senate Agriculture Committee, led by Sen. Elmer E. Rau, R.-Pa., and Rep. John W. Hausermann, D-Pa., introduced a bill to extend the program for another year and to expand its coverage to include more than half of the country.
