

Waste Paper Shortage Threatening War Plants

Nelson Appeals for Heavier Collection of This Critical Material

Donald M. Nelson, chairman of the War Production Board, in a telegraphic appeal to the Daily Dispatch today called for additional efforts on the part of the citizens of this section in the salvaging of waste paper, saying some of the most important war materials have already been exhausted. He said that the vital raw material and some have been forced to shut down temporarily because of the shortage of waste paper.

Nelson made his appeal today by way of the Henderson Daily Dispatch, charging that 85 percent of the waste paper in the United States is available to the industry, and 85 percent from the houses and farms in the country. The survey showed that in this country there are 100 million tons of waste paper available each year, but only 43 percent from the paper mills.

Collecting waste paper since the war began, it is estimated that the country has a total of 100 million tons of waste paper available each year, but only 43 percent from the paper mills.

During May, there were 622,000 tons of waste paper turned in, about 43 percent of the goal set. During June, receipts were 84 percent of the quota, further cutting into the reserve supply of industry.

The WPB chairman said "obviously continuation of this dangerous situation will not only jeopardize war production but cause further curtailment of the dismissed allotments of civilian paper."

Eighty-three percent of the families are saving waste paper regularly, and only 97 percent are conserving the need of waste paper. "This is astonishing in the light of your generous support," Nelson said. "Waste paper in the nation's number one critical war material, and so essential the army is now preparing to salvage what little they can of North Africa and South Pacific combat zones, Nelson declared.

Nelson called upon every man, woman and child for redoubled efforts in the U. S. Victory waste paper campaign.

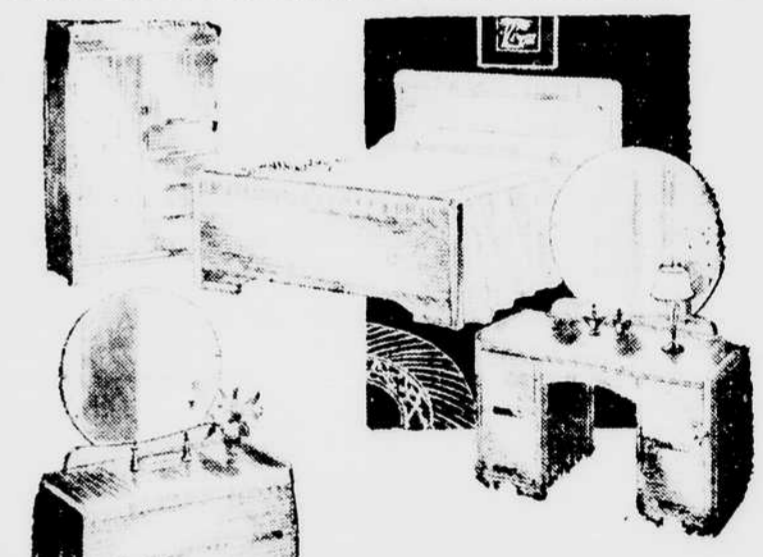
