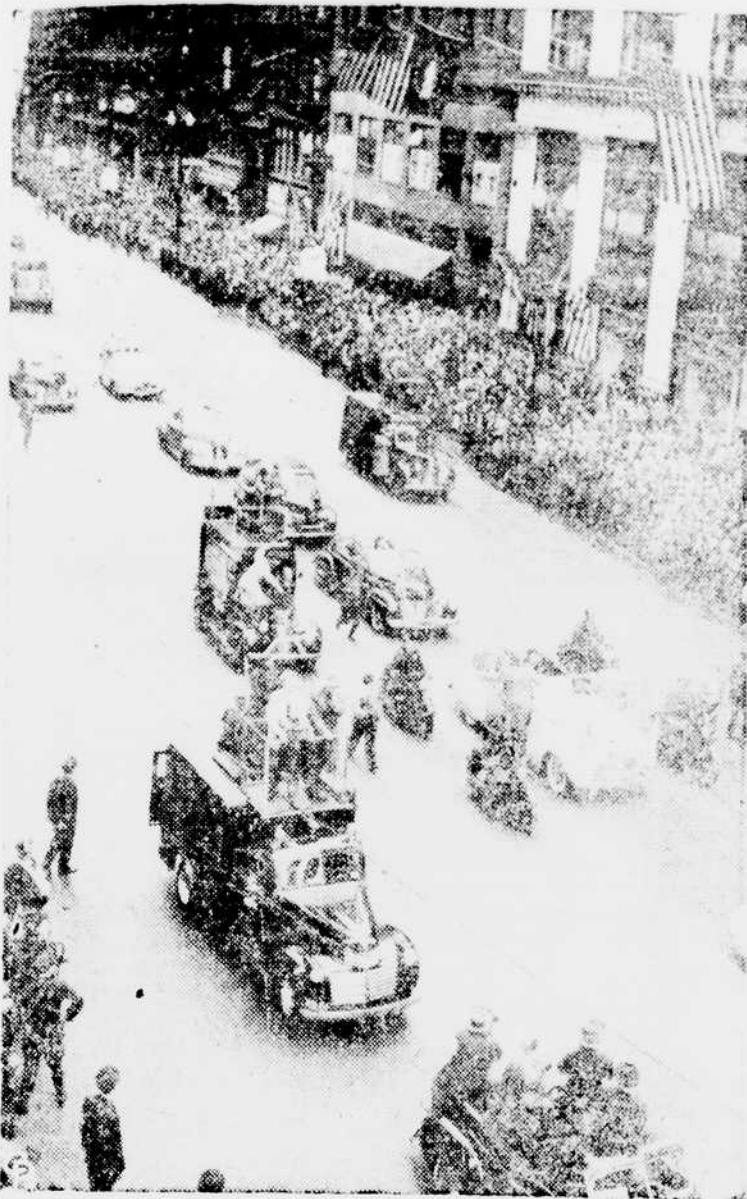


## MODERN 'CITY DESK' ON WHEELS



When you see a picture of your presidential choice in the newspaper a few hours after it was snapped, you may wonder how it came about. This picture shows the Republican presidential nominee, Gov. Evans F. Doney, and his party during his tour in Chicago. Note the cameramen standing atop platforms built on newspaper trucks taking photos. These are quickly developed and printed in a dark room in one of the trucks on the spot. The photos are sent to newspaper offices and arrive in time for use with an "on the scene" description that has been prepared by a reporter atop the truck in the left foreground by means of his radio-telephone equipment.
