

BATTLE LINES IN TWO WORLD WARS



In this map, broken line indicates how Allied front stood at end of first World War in 1918. Area (A) shows how far advanced to date. But below Metz (B) the lines became practically identical. At (C) our advance in World War I was well ahead of the present line.

AS THE BIG WINTER PUSH on the Western Front gains momentum, the above map affords an interesting comparison of the battle line where World War I ended with the present front. It has been pointed out that just below Metz the lines are almost identical, but these the parallel ends, for the drives into Holland and north of Aachen have carried the Allied troops miles beyond the 1918 front.
