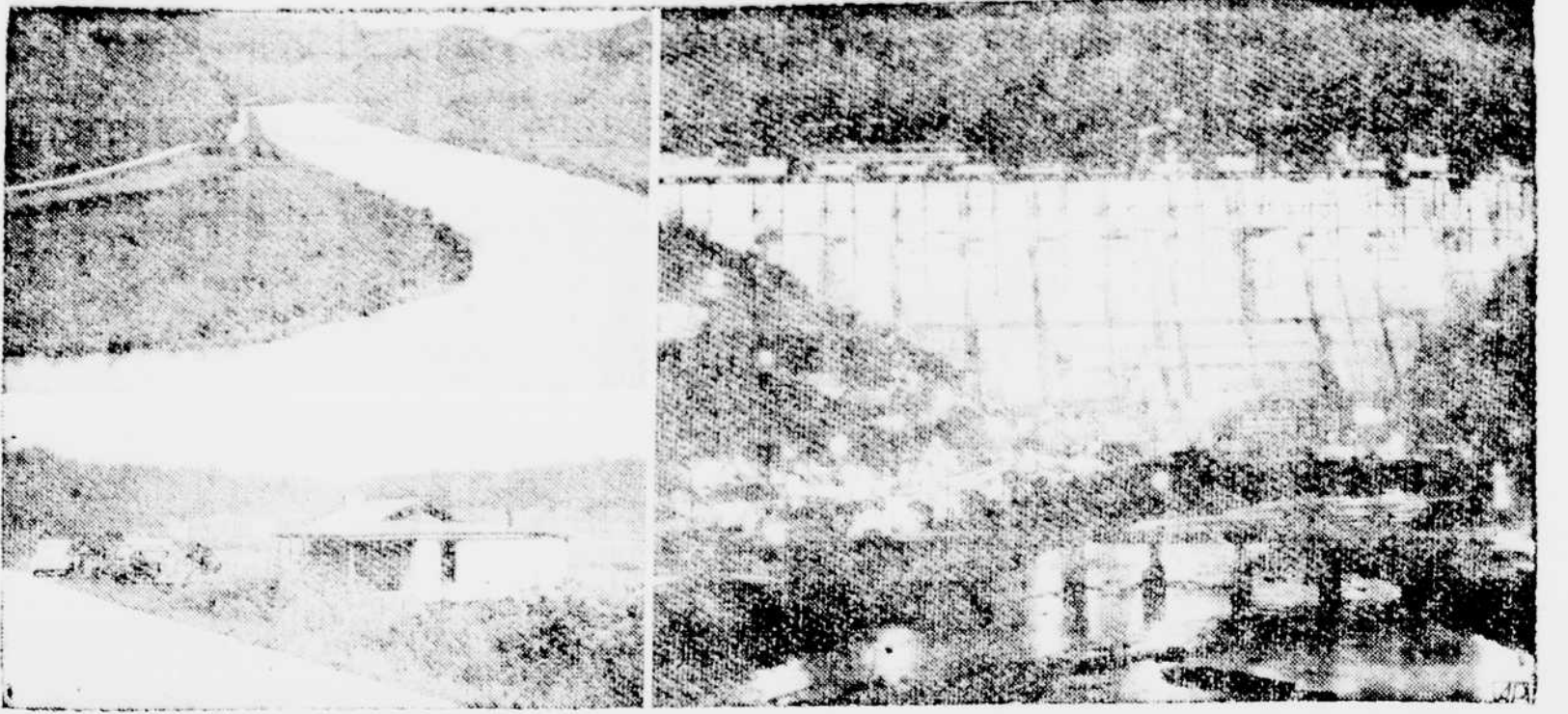


VIEWS OF NORTH CAROLINA'S HUGE FONTANA DAM
