Bishops At Canterbury Rights

New York, April 20.—Two official representatives of the American churches, Bishop G. Bromley Oxnam of New York, and Bishop Henry Knox Sherrill of Boston, attended the enthronement of the Rt. Rev. Geoffrey Francis Fisher as Archbishop of Canterbury last night in England, it was announced here today.

At the ceremonies, Bishop Sherrill represented the Protestant Episcopal Church and its presiding bishop, the Rt. Rev. Henry St. George Tucker, and Bishop Oxnam represented the Federal Council of the Churches of Christ in America. This is the second time that American churches not of the Anglican family have been invited to be represented at an enthronement at Canterbury. The previous occasion was

in connection with the enthronement of Dr. William Temple in April 1932. Bishop Oxnam and Bishop Sherrill left the United States on April 14, and before returning are to make extended visits to the chaplains and servicemen overseas as representatives of the General Commission on Army and Navy Chaplains. With the approval of the secretary of war and the secretary of the navy, Bishop Sherrill, who is bishop of the Episcopal Diocese of Massachusetts, and vice-chairman of the General Commission, will cover the European theatre of operations, and Bishop Oxnam, resident bishop of the New York area of the Methodist Church and president of the Federal Council of Churches, will go to the Mediterranean theatre.
