

OPA Checking Violators Against Gas Allowances

Raleigh, April 23.—The Raleigh district OPA office is double-checking cases of persons apprehended for speeding or reckless driving all over North Carolina, South Carolina and Virginia and guilty drivers who live within the district are finding themselves with papers of court judgments involving OPA.
